Cajun Classic World Ranking

- Players compete in the four Grand Slams -- US Open, Wimbledon, French Open, and Australian Open
- Cajun Classic is an ITF Super Series tournament - only one in the United States and four in the world
- Cajun Classic is ranked just below Grand Slams
- Like other world-class tournaments, the Cajun Classic must pay stipulated prize money (\$45,000 total)
- Cajun Classic must use USTA certified and ITF badged officials
